#### **Training activities -Sailing (Broadmeadows)**

- An IS qualified Power Boat and Safety Boat Senior Instructor will be responsible for training.
- The Senior Instructor is responsible for authorising activities afloat and the management of sail training activities

Instructors with the appropriate level of qualification shall be employed for delivering courses.

- Power boats to be used in the course must be fully prepared and ready to launch before course participants arrive.
- The weather forecast for the day must be checked by the Senior Instructor and communicated to all participants.
- Any relevant medical conditions must be indicated on the course booking form and this information must be given to the Senior Instructor and relevant instructors.
- Suitable clothing must be worn by instructors and trainees as stated in Appendix 3
  of MYC Safety statement. For winter or early spring Courses, all participants must
  be advised to wear suitable clothing which must include full Foul Weather Gear,
  Hats and Gloves.
- It is the responsibility of the instructor to decide if a cadet sailor is suitably dressed for the weather conditions.
- The ratio of students to instructors will be 3:1, as prescribed by IS.
- All incidents or accidents must be reported to the Senior Instructor and recorded on the relevant form.
